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# **DIRECTOR'S LETTER**

I feel privileged to mention that KTS is continuing all social activities such as free nursery / primary school, orphan home and day care centre. Similarly it is continuing free hand knitting training, carpet weaving and carpentry trainings with allowances without outside funding.

Two thousand home based producer members are involved in knitting woollen, cotton and banana fibre knitwear under KTS in an income generating programme this year. Pre-production training is introduced this year to build capacity to staff and producers which have helped to reduce product rejects and rework, making the production more efficient and improve the quality of products.

Despite of continued decline sales in the international market, orders from existing buyers and orders from some new buyers from the mainstream market are keeping us going. Our participation in the Ambiente Trade Fair is starting to generate some results putting us into contact with mainstream buyers who are also interested in Fair Trade and Ethical Trade. Our focus on products range for the Ambinente has been in home textiles which are well received by all the trade fair visitors. Through the marketing of our home textile products we are expecting to build relations with the new mainstream buyers and Fair Trade buyers. This will enable us to provide regular job opportunities to our home based producers. We hope our efforts will also contribute to alleviate poverty in the country.

KTS management is working on sourcing local raw materials such as high altitude cotton and banana fibre for its products. To a certain extent we have been successful in sourcing banana fibre and also blending the banana fibre with wool adding value increment in our products. Despite our efforts to promote sales through new product development and use of local raw materials, we are facing difficulties as the cost of raw materials and wages are increasing making hard constantly to maintain the cost of production as a Fair Trade organization. Its direct effect and big threat are on running of social activities, free primary school, orphan home and vocational training as well as an income generating programme.

We would like to express our sincere gratitude to our national and international friends, well-wishers and buyers for their continued cooperation and supports.

### **ABOUT KTS**

Established in 1983 by former State Council Member, Mr Siddhi Bahadur Khadgi, Kumbeshwar Technical School (KTS) is an educational and vocational training centre supporting the needs of low-income families throughout Nepal. As a non-profit, Fair Trade NGO, KTS believes that "equal opportunities for all" is a fundamental human right.

KTS was initially established to assist the local Pode community of street sweepers because, as a caste of untouchables, these people had been denied education and employment opportunities. The rest of society shunned them and it was virtually impossible to break free from the traditional caste occupations of street sweepers, butchers and small farmers. In 1983 a childcare project for street cleaning workers was established, followed by adult literacy classes and a nutrition and health clinic, including an immunisation programme.

KTS officially opened the primary school in 1987 where a carpet weaving training programme for adults was already in place and a production unit was established to fund the School. The KTS organisation today encompasses a free nursery and primary school for poor children and offers welfare and education for up to 20 orphan/semi-orphan children in the KTS orphanage. KTS provides vocational training for teenagers in carpet weaving, hand knitting and carpentry.

As a founder member of Fair Trade Group Nepal and a Guaranteed member of WFTO (World Fair Trade Organization) and WFTO Asia, KTS strongly believes in Fair Trade practices and is committed in working with its producers to create Fair Trade products. KTS has installed Fair Trade income-generating programmes to support producers and artisans, through the sale of high-quality Fair Trade carpets, knitwear and furniture. All the income from sales are used for KTS activities. KTS also runs a day-care centre for the children of trainees, producers and staff, free of charge.

KTS is managed by a seven-member Executive Committee, which makes all the policy decisions relating to the organisation. The Member Secretary and Director of KTS has overall responsibility for policy implementation. The KTS administrative team manages the organisation's day-to-day running. The KTS primary school teachers' committee bears responsibility for the Nursery and Primary School. The administration staff and a vocational teachers' committee oversee the Vocational School.

# WHAT WE DO

KTS offers key opportunities to create a secure future. Local children from low-income families learn vital literacy skills and receive a broad and quality education in the KTS Nursery and Primary School. Vocational training in carpet weaving, hand knitting and carpentry opens access to a wide range of employment opportunities. KTS assists in the creation of incomegenerating programmes that directly benefit low-income groups and, in particular, women and the physically challenged. Orphans and destitute women are offered a home, education and training. KTS also works to empower the local community and the wider population to take responsibility for themselves and their future. As a founder member of Fair Trade Group Nepal and a Guaranteed member of WFTO Global and WFTO Asia, as well as a member of Goodweave Nepal KTS strongly believes in Fair Trade practices and is committed to work with its producers to create Fair Trade products.

On 19th May we conducted an In-house Design Competition where Ms Meera Bhattarai, Founder Chair of Fair Trade Group Nepal and Founder of ACP (Associations of Craft Producers) shared her experience of Fair Trade in Nepal. She inspired women producers and personnel of KTS to work for empowerment through the success story she shared of Women Empowerment.







Finally a programme of Free Women's Health, Eye check-up and Free Cataract Surgery Camp as well as Menopause awareness were launched on 25 May 2018. The health camp was conducted with support from Nepal Eye Hospital, Menopause Society of Nepal and 11 Ward Health Implementation Committee, Lalitpur Metropolitan City. It was a rewarding day for many of our staff, producers and local community people taking advantage of this camp.

267 people had their eyes checked and 9 people were found to have cataracts. The Camp was conducted in association with Nepal Eye Hospital. Kumbeshwar Trading Centre supported with medicine and logistics for the camp. The cataract surgery is done in Nepal Eye Hospital. Dr. Indu Dhungel, Dr. Sujal Shrestha, Ophthalmic assistant Mr. Kalyan Dhungana, Ms. Prativa Basnet and Ms. Punjya Kumari Chaudhari from Nepal Eye Hospital conducted the eye camp.

### WELFARE OF STAFF AND PRODUCERS

21 staff and 9 producers benefited from KTS saving credit programme. Most of them used the money for renovating houses, land purchases, children's education and extend family businesses.



### Kauli Chana ko tarkari (chickpeas)

Serves 10-12

### Ingredients

- ½kg kauli chana (chickpeas)
- 1 onion, chopped
- 3 large tomatoes, chopped
- 1 tablespoon ginger garlic paste
- 1 teaspoon cumin powder
- ½ teaspoon coriander powder
- 3 tablespoons grated coconut
- 1 teaspoon red chilli powder
- ½ teaspoon turmeric powder
- 3 tablespoons oil
- Salt to taste
- 4 tablespoons chopped coriander
- 2 medium size chopped onions

#### Method

- 1. Soak the chickpeas overnight in plenty of cold water.
- 2. Wash the soaked chickpeas and boil in a cooking pot for about 40 minutes or until soft (if cooked in a pressure cooker, cook for about 25 minutes. Keep aside.
- 3. Heat the oil in a pan. Fry the chopped onion, add ginger garlic paste, grated coconut and stir gently. Add rest of the spices and tomatoes. Fry and stir gently until tomatoes are soft (fry for about 1 minute).
- 4. Add the boiled chickpeas including remaining water into the fried spices. Mash the chickpeas gently with the help of a spoon. Add a little water and simmer for about 5 minutes. There should be a little juice left in the dish. Remove from the heat.
- 5. Garnish with chopped onion and coriander.





Management also provided accommodation facility to her mother and temporary part time job in the organization as per recommendation of NWC.

Ms. Urmila Gurung and Mr. Gangaram Khatri have successfully completed grade Xll. Urmila has left the orphanage and is living with her mother. She plans to continue her academic education for Bachelor of Arts and find a job. Gangaram is planning to continue his academy education for Bachelor in Engineering and has applied for scholarship in different agencies. He requested KTS management to stay in KTS for a few months. KTS management wishes Urmila Gurung and Gangaram Khatri happiness, prosperity and successful lives.

Aashman Bal, Bishowman Bham, Asali Bal Tamang and Shikshit Devi Bham are studying at KTS, all of them are doing well. Pema Lama is in Day Care at KTS.

Harinna Shahi, Kisan Chepang, Sunil Sing Bista, Sinha Rai, Subina Achhami, Shanti Tamang and Sudip Gurung are studying at local Community school and doing well.

Namrata Thapa is continuing to help in assisting Orphanage management. She is continuing her study for a Bachelor degree in Business Administration with sponsorship from Sukha Foundation. She is doing very well in her studies.

Gopal Khatri is continuing a Bachelor degree Course in Electrical Engineering with partial support of Sukha Foundation, Netherland. KTS management is providing him part-time job at the Carpet Weaving Production Unit with special study facilities.

In the home 5 meals are served daily to the students - Tea with bread at 6.15 am, morning meal Nepalese Dal Bhat at 8 am, snacks at 1 pm, snacks with tea at 4 pm and dinner Nepalese Dal Bhat at 7 pm.

KASIN UK generously took K of K UK membership programme under their umbrella. KASIN CHARITY sponsored the orphanage this year and supported for food for the year, which is a great support for us.

At present 14 (7 girls and 7 boys) children are in the orphanage. Management is trying to provide a homely atmosphere to orphans.

Kids of Kumbeshwar membership programme had partially helped to run the orphanage. This year KASHIN sponsorship covered food expenses of the year. 56.55% of expenses of the orphanage have been covered by the membership subscriptions with sponsorships of friends and individual well-wishers. The remaining 43.45% expenses were covered by the KTS incomegenerating programmes through the sales of knitwear and carpet.

**Success story** 

Rajan Thapa Magar was born on 2<sup>nd</sup> April 1988 at Dhading. His father was expired in a road accident. After his father's death her mother came for a job at KTS with his brother Dhan Bahadur. KTS management considered her job request and appointed her as an assistant maid and admitted him with his brother at the orphanage on September 1991.

Rajan completed his SLC in 2004 and did a hotel management course in waiting, housekeeping and cooking with full sponsorship of KTS. After successfully completing the study he did on-the-job training at Grand Hotel, Kathmandu. After that he tried to get a job in Malaysia and luckily he succeeded at Lucky Famous Restaurant in Kwalalampur, Malaysia and worked for 3 years. He had been working in many different restaurants and departmental stores in Malaysia and Middle East. After the devastating earthquake in March 2012, he returned to Kathmandu to support his family and normalise their lives. Now he is looking for a job possibly in Saudi Arabia.

New education session started with 207 children (101 boys – 106 girls), among them 12 children (4 boys and 8 girls) from Deula community (local street sweeper community) and others are from local and migrated poor families from the countryside.

59 children are in the pre-nursery and nursery classes and they enjoy snacks twice daily. 26 children in kindergarten classes enjoy snacks once daily. In all, 85 children receive nutritious snacks to keep them healthy.

Teacher training and internal teacher's workshops have improved teaching methods and delivering quality education to the students.

Students are learning practical knowledge from library class with the guidance of teachers following modern International children books and audio-visual materials.

In the Computer classes students are learning basic knowledge of theory and practice according to the grade. All students are active in the Computer class.

All the students are actively participating in extra-curricular activities such as spelling contests, quiz contests, games, drawing, poetry, story writing, reading and culture programmes.

Valued buyers, friends, well-wishers and the Friends of Kumbeshwar Kids membership programme have helped to run the Nursery /Primary School. This year, 56% of expenses were covered by the support extended by our valuable buyers, Friends, Well-wishers and the Friends of Kumbeshwar Kids members and 44% covered by sales revenue from knitwear, carpet products and bank interest from fixed deposit funds

# **DAY-CARE CENTRE**

The Day Care Centre is helpful to mothers of young children, trainees, staff and producers. Mothers can breast feed as per babies' need. There is no time limit or any restrictions. KTS provides free snacks to the children twice a day.

The teachers and maids carefully look after the children. According to age, teachers encourage them to play and enjoy colouring, singing, dancing, story-telling, playing and sleep etc. Normally the day care centre time is 9 am to 5 pm, 8 hours a day. But as per the needs of parents, child care facilities are extended accordingly.

This year 16 children attend regularly in the day care centre with 5 children joining after school and 13 more children join the day care during the school holidays. One teacher and 2 maids take care of the children.









This year, 64% of expenses were covered from the support extended by our valuable buyers, Friends, Well-wishers and the Friends of Kumbeshwar Kids members and 36% covered by sales revenue from knitwear, carpet products and bank interest from fixed deposit funds.

The Day Care Centre enables mothers to give full attention to their work. The centre costs an average NPR 3,332.00 per month and NPR 111.00 per child per day and parents contribute NPR 25 per month for each child.

# VOCATIONAL TRAINING

KTS is committed to provide quality training in Hand knitting, Carpet weaving and Carpentry (Furniture making) to underprivileged people, especially to women and physically challenged people to sustain their lives. KTS focuses on practical knowledge which help graduates to find jobs easily. KTS is proud to mention that KTS had already provided skills to more than 2,386 men and women and 128 physically challenged people and women prisoners. Altogether 2,514 people have completed training in the school. The school continues to run all these vocational training programmes smoothly.

# HAND KNITTING TRAINING

Hand knitting training is popular among adult girls, destitute women and physically challenged people. After completing the hand knitting training, the trainees get jobs easily and is helpful to College girls, destitute women and physically challenged people and those women who, for various reasons, are tied to household responsibilities.

KTS provides job opportunities to trainees who show real aptitude for the work, offering them opportunities to produce smaller items such as socks, gloves and scarves for which KTS pays wages at the same rate payable to professionals.

The training schedule is 2 hours a day, 5 days a week and a practical session in trainees' home for three months. The training has been fixed at convenient times for household women and scheduled for 11:30 am to 1:30 pm, being the most convenient time for trainees.

The trainees who can afford, contribute NPR 450 (US\$ 4.05) for the 390 hour course. During the training period, KTS provides all stationery materials and wool free of charge.

After training, KTS offers job opportunities to all graduates who are interested to work in KTS's income generating programme. It encourages trainees to complete the training and gain experience to work full-time and be independent artisans in the future.

This year 28 women joined the training programme, 23 trainees completed the training and 16 graduates joined the hand-knitting income generating production unit.

The average monthly cost for the training is NPR 1,754.50 per person and a trainee contributes only NPR 150.00 per month, the balance cost being borne by the income generating programme.





# CARPET WEAVING TRAINING

The Carpet weaving short term practical training is attractive to poor and low educated local household women, migrated girls, women and physically challenged people. After training graduates can get employment quickly, which helps them to earn and be self-dependent.

The training course is for 390 hours as per Council for Technical Education and Vocational Training, i.e, 6 hours a day, 5 days a week for 4 months and 2 months on-the-job training. KTS provides NPR 150 per day as an allowance to trainees during training and if trainees have small babies they can stay at KTS Day Care Centre. If the children are above 2.5 years they can attend KTS Nursery/primary school. After training the graduates are not bonded; they can work or hold jobs in other carpet industries according to their wishes.

This year 13 trainees were admitted for carpet weaving training, 9 completed the training and joined the KTS income generating programme.

Average monthly cost for the training is NPR 2,797.00. All expenses are covered by KTS income generating programme and school fund.

# CARPENTRY TRAINING

Carpentry skill is a highly job-orientated training. Therefore, KTS is continuing this training. As per potential trainees' expectations KTS started to provide short term training according to CTEVT (Council for Technical Education and Vocational Training) curriculum which is 390 hours course but added 9 months practical training as on-the-job in an income generating unit. After completion of training trainees become skilled enough to sit on the level II skill test exam, which is the minimum qualification for the job.

This year 3 boys were admitted to the training course. Out of them 2 dropped out and only one trainee completed the course at the end of this year and is doing practical training. Due to teenagers' high expectations, attraction to carpentry training has declined. KTS management publicises and targets core areas of the target groups throughout country.

At present, KTS is providing NPR 200 per day as training allowance to trainees for partial support of their living costs. This allowance is helpful in supporting them while they are on the training. KTS hands over a set of hand tools used by each student on the completion of their training.

Minimum qualification of the trainee is grade five and open to anyone older than 15 years. The average monthly cost for the training is NPR 11,070.00 which is borne by the income generating programme and KTS fund.





# INCOME GENERATING PROGRAMME



The revenue from all income generating programmes is the main financial base of the organization to run all social activities and to sustain the organization itself.

KTS income generating programmes are helping to train underprivileged people and especially providing job opportunities to women and physically challenged people. These programmes also extend support to

poor "grass root" people in need of help and also to contribute to alleviate poverty in the country.



KTS provides fair wages on a piece work basis with medical insurance, health awareness programme, saving credit facilities, and sponsorship of children for those who are unable to afford the expense of sending their children to school or college.

As a guaranteed Fair Trade, non-profit making, non-government organization, KTS adheres to 10 Fair Trade Standards of the World Fair Trade Organization in its operations. At present, KTS has 89 staff and over 2,137 producers benefiting over 1,587 families. All the income from these programmes are directly used for KTS social activities such as free nursery/primary school, orphan home, free vocational training and child care programmes plus other social activities including health care, sponsor for producers' child education, staff training and local community social programmes.

## HAND KNITTING INCOME GENERATING PROG.

Hand knitting income generating programme is of great value for graduates, college girls, housewives and physically challenged people for their social and economic empowerment as well as the sustainability of KTS.

This hand knitting income generating programme provides job opportunities to hand knitting graduates, college girls, housewives and physically challenged people to utilize their leisure time as a way of earning money. A knitting job helps them to be economically independent and gives them social empowerment as well. Most of the knitters use the income to partially support the day-to-day living expenses of their families.

In the income generating programme there are two types of producer members: direct (individual) and indirect (who work through group leaders). The direct (individual) producers are fully responsible for producing quality products who then submit the knitted products to KTS on time. Indirect members, working under group leaders are responsible for producing quality products on time and to submit the knitwear through their group leaders. Direct and indirect members all receive the same wages, benefits and facilities as other people working at KTS in an income generating programme. KTS provides regular skill upgrade training to all the direct and indirect members.










This year 417 direct producers, 17 group leaders, 403 producers working under group leaders and 1,300 assistants in knitting are involved in the programme. Altogether 2,116 women, 19 disabled women, 1 physically challenged man and 1 man are engaged in production. Fifteen people are involved in transporting raw materials to producers and collecting the finished products from them.

This year, sales revenue increased by 12.28% compared to last year.










Dyed yarn winding for knitting

This year the Carpet weaving income generating programme is less busy due to limited orders. However orders from Made by Node UK founded by illustrator Mr. Chris Haughton and some individual custom design carpet orders kept our weavers busy.

The cost of raw materials and wage increases are big challenges to compete in the market. However our customers are happy with the quality which is inspiring us to work hard. We

hope KTS well-wishers, friends and customers understand the situation and help us by placing orders of KTS handmade woollen or banana Carpets. Your small help will be of great assistance to us to keep busy and to enable our artisans to become socially and economically empowered. We are proud to say that KTS discovered the technique of making carpets using hand spun banana yarn from Nepalese banana fibre. The banana yarn carpet is a multi-season product due to its natural fibre as it is neither warm in summer nor cool in the winter. The popularity of banana carpets will help to reduce materials going to waste, provide additional income to the artisans and prove a milestone in helping to alleviate poverty in our country.

There are 4 wool spinners, 14 carpet weavers, 1 trimmer and 2 dyers working in the unit.
